Lucyvivor describes herself as a walking diary. She wants you to know that she accepts you for who you are.

Four words to describe Lucyvivor: authentic, brave, poetic and lovely. She is almost a personification of her music; a rap, nu-metal combo exhibited best in her current single [Sick Of It](#). Her brand? Resilience and determination.

Her bold blend of rap and rock along with a strong lyrical theme has worked to her advantage when submitting music for consideration, which she's done again and again - not just the once and then crossing fingers and toes. Her music has been played on Hip Hop radio shows and podcasts, as well as rock radio, ([Amazing](#)) and including [BBC Introducing](#).

“Poetry and music have been one of my key routes to helping me through really dark situations,” she explains.

Bullied at school, (she is blind in one eye and only recently diagnosed with ADHD), Lucyvivor admits that mental health is a tricky topic, “but I’d say it tests your bravery!” To cope with the bullying, she started to write poetry. These poems then turned to raps because she “ended up putting beats behind them”, inspired by artists such as Eminem, Nova Twins, G Flip and Linkin Park.

“And Lauren Sanderson as well! Lauren Sanderson is from a rough kind of neighbourhood in America, one that doesn't look too kindly upon the LGBT community.

“The moment that a track hits me strongly I’m like right what makes that...? Imagine blending that with this....

“I think I used Black Magix’s Music Maker for the PC first, and then Garageband, which has evolved to my using Logic Pro.”

Lucyvivor worked with a producer for her latest track, Jim White, who also contributes brilliant vocals. Right now she’s concentrating on the rest of her EP and hoping to do an album in the future.
